

**Option A: Sterling Elementary boundaries will remain as currently defined**

**Sterling Elementary**

Current Enrollment 762 – capacity 900

Option A description:

Current boundaries will remain as they currently exist. Students living outside of the walking distance to the new location of Sterling Elementary will be transported by bus.

Future enrollment 762 students

**Option A: Transition the DLI program from Middle Canyon to Copper Canyon over the next 3 years. No boundary adjustment is required.**

**Middle Canyon Elementary**

Current Enrollment 679 – capacity 675/700

Option A description:

Transition 1<sup>st</sup> grade DLI program to Copper Canyon Elementary from Middle Canyon next year (2017-2018). The following year, 2<sup>nd</sup> grade DLI would attend Copper Canyon and the third year, 3<sup>rd</sup> grade would attend Copper Canyon. (The teacher moves, but no students will be moved, or current teachers could remain at Middle Canyon and teach another grade.)

Current Middle Canyon DLI students would remain at Middle Canyon and move forward one grade each year. This allows all students who are currently attending the DLI program at Middle Canyon to remain there for their Elementary years.

At the end of the third year with the students in the program grades 1 through 3, enrollment would determine if the program is continued to grow at Copper Canyon or shared between the 2 schools.

Requires no boundary adjustment.

Future enrollment for option A: Remains at approximately 679

**Copper Canyon Elementary**

Current enrollment: 659 – capacity 650/675

Students currently attending Copper Canyon from Benson Gristmill area and Delgada will return to Stansbury Park.

#### Option A:

Transition 1<sup>st</sup> grade DLI program to Copper Canyon Elementary from Middle Canyon next year. The following year, 2<sup>nd</sup> grade DLI would attend Copper Canyon and the third year, 3<sup>rd</sup> grade would attend Copper Canyon. (The teacher moves, but no students will be moved.)

Current Middle Canyon DLI students would remain at Middle Canyon and move forward one grade each year. This allows all students who are currently attending the DLI program at Middle Canyon to remain there for their Elementary years.

At the end of the third year with the students in the program grades 1 through 3, enrollment would determine if the program is continued to grow at Copper Canyon or shared between the 2 schools.

Requires no boundary adjustment.

Future enrollment for option A: Year 1 – 483 + 30 = 513, Year 2 + 30 = 543, Year 3 +30= 573. Additional growth is predicted in the Copper Canyon boundary.

#### **Criteria for evaluation of boundary options:**

1. Capacity of the school - relieve current overcrowding and plan for future growth.  
Slow to build capacity at Copper Canyon. Does not change Middle Canyon.
2. Neighborhood proximity of schools  
No change
3. Transitions – Minimize future transitions for students  
Does not affect current Middle Canyon students.
4. Safety of students: Transportation and safe walking paths  
No change
5. Continuity - Feeder school concept  
Does not change feeder schools

**Option B: Move the Spanish DLI program to Copper Canyon. Change the boundary of students living behind Walmart that are currently being bussed to Copper Canyon to Middle Canyon boundaries.**

#### **Middle Canyon Elementary**

Current Enrollment 679 – capacity 675/700

Option B description:

Move the DLI program to Copper Canyon Elementary school next year. The current program has approximately 170 students, with approximately half of those students 90 coming from Middle Canyon Elementary. (Three teachers would be relocated to Copper Canyon along with the students.) Siblings of DLI students may also be attending Middle Canyon Elementary.

Students behind Walmart in the apartments/condos currently bussed to Copper Canyon would be bussed to Middle Canyon. (These students currently feed into CJJHS). Approximately 77 students reside there while only about 55 students attend Copper Canyon.

Future enrollment for Option B: approximately 589

### **Copper Canyon Elementary**

Current enrollment: 659 – capacity 650/675

Students currently attending Copper Canyon from Benson Gristmill area and Delgada will return to Stansbury Park.

Option B:

Move the DLI program to Copper Canyon Elementary school next year. The current program has approximately 170 students with approximately half of those students (90) coming from Middle Canyon Elementary. (Three teachers would be relocated to Copper Canyon along with the students.) Siblings of DLI students may also be attending Middle Canyon Elementary.

Students behind Walmart in the apartments currently bussed to Copper Canyon would be bussed to Middle Canyon. (These students currently feed into CJJHS).

Future enrollment for option B: 573 plus a possible 30 students for DLI program each of the next 3 years. Could be up to 663 at end of 6<sup>th</sup> grade if 30 students were added each year. Additional growth is predicted in the Copper Canyon boundary.

### **Criteria for evaluation of boundary options:**

1. Capacity of the school - relieve current overcrowding and plan for future growth.  
Yes, immediate change. Unknown future growth in Copper Canyon boundaries.
2. Neighborhood proximity of schools  
Students remain walking distance. Some dual immersion students from Middle Canyon boundaries will travel further distances.
3. Transitions – Minimize future transitions for students  
Unknown in a growing community
4. Safety of students: Transportation and safe walking paths  
Yes.
5. Continuity – Feeder school concept  
No. Changes feeder school boundaries for students behind Walmart

**Option C: Move the neighborhood subdivision of Carr Fork of approximately 90 students from walking to Middle Canyon Elementary and bus the students to Copper Canyon Elementary. Several homes on the northwest corner of the subdivision are within the 1.5 mile walking distance to Copper Canyon Elementary.**

**Middle Canyon Elementary**

Current Enrollment 679 – capacity 675/700

Option C description:

Students living in the Middle Canyon neighborhood of Carr Fork will change boundaries and be bussed to Copper Canyon Elementary.

Future enrollment for Option C: approximately 589 students the first year. An additional 30 students may be added each year with a possible enrollment of 679 at the end of 6 years. Student numbers in DLI program may be reduced since students are not backfilled in upper grades.

**Copper Canyon Elementary**

Current enrollment: 659 – capacity 650/675

Students currently attending Copper Canyon from Benson Gristmill area and Delgada will return to Stansbury Park. (483 students)

Option C: Students from Carr Fork neighborhood will be bussed to Copper Canyon Elementary.

Future enrollment for Option C: 573

**Criteria for evaluation of boundary options:**

1. Capacity of the school - relieve current overcrowding and plan for future growth.  
Yes, immediate change.
2. Neighborhood proximity of schools  
No. Students within walking distance of a neighborhood school will be bussed to another school.
3. Transitions – Minimize future transitions for students  
Unknown in a growing community
4. Safety of students: Transportation and safe walking paths  
Yes.
5. Continuity – Feeder school concept  
No. Changes feeder school for students. Carr Fork students will attend TJHS.
